## PROBATIONARY MEMBER LOG

By definition clubs are all about shared activity and the purpose of the Probationary period and this log is to ensure that you move about and experience the many and varied activities that comprise the Fremantle Sailing Club.

We hope that you will enjoy the experience and become a willing, active member.

New members are required to participate in a range of Club activities, accruing a minimum of 20 points within 12 months of joining. Should you complete your Probationary requirements before then, so much the better. Accumulate 20 points over the twelve months and progress to Senior Membership.

### ***The allocation of points is as follows:***

Participate in the Opening Day Sailpast – accrue five points

Attendance at **one** Club General Meeting is compulsory – accrue three points.

A **Section On Water Activity** accrues three points. These include a Sailing Race (including JaM and Twilight events), an organized Cruising or Power event, an Angling, Game Fishing or Dive Section outing or on-water clinic, or any duty on a Start Boat.

A **Club/Section Organized Activity** accrues two points. Any event or meeting organized by the Club, or a Section, and include the following:

- Attendance at Opening Day
- Assisting on the Harbour Cleanup Day
- Assisting at an Anode Replacement Day
- Attending a Section Monthly Meeting
- Attending programmed Bosun Section Work Tasks

**Programmed Bosun Section Work Tasks** include boat maintenance days, marker buoy maintenance activities, 'special event' on-water support, and programmed Club maintenance tasks.

**Bosuns "odd jobs"** such as refuelling a boat, assisting on a dinghy, or an eye bolt and jetty numbering task, will attract one point.

When you have completed your requirements, and not later than 12 months from commencing your membership, please present or send this log to:

## HOUSE RULES:

**Dress Standards:** Members and their guests shall be suitably attired while in the Clubhouse. Footwear is required at all times. Clothing should be clean and dry. Clean and dry shall be interpreted as being in a condition that will not permit dirt or moisture to be transferred to the furnishings. Singlets, swim wear, headgear (except on religious grounds), and wet clothing are not acceptable. In the upstairs Function Rooms dress shall be suitable for the occasion, but a minimum shall be neat casual.

**Mobile Phones:** To minimise the disturbance of other members please take/ make mobile calls outside the Clubhouse.

*Remember, you are responsible for your visitors.*

## GROUNDS AND JETTIES:

1. Dogs are not permitted within the premises except for the purpose of embarkation onto, or disembarkation from members boats.

Dogs are not permitted within the Clubhouse, must be on leash or restrained at all times, and members are responsible for disposing of any dog litter immediately.

Dogs may not be left unattended in vehicles or on members vessels under any circumstance, once a dog is onboard the members boat or returned to the member's vehicle, they must exit club premises immediately.

2. NO discharge into the harbour.
3. Barrows are to be returned to depots, never left on jetties. Return barrows before leaving the harbour.
4. Pedestrian access ONLY to pens. No bicycles or other vehicles permitted on jetties.
5. Power usage - If you wish to have your vessel permanently connected to power for fridges/chargers etc, it is essential that this be arranged with Reception.
6. Washing vessels - Hoses are to be fitted with a "water stop nozzle" to prevent wastage.
