Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSI)

Skippers are responsible for deciding whether to participate or not, and for compliance with all applicable rules and regulations, including all COVID regulations.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The Opening Day Race will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024, and Fremantle Sailing Clubs Sailing Handbook (Redbook).

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Any change to the schedule of races or course will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

Any amendments to the Supplementary Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0830 on the day it will take effect.

3 COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1 All competing yachts shall log on by radio to the Fremantle Inshore Race Control on VHF 72 before the start of the first fleet.
There is no requirement to log off after the race, crossing the finishing line will suffice.
- 3.2 Yachts retiring prior to starting or during a race shall notify Fremantle Inshore Race Control by radio before leaving the race area.
- 3.3 All yachts shall maintain a constant listening watch on VHF72 whilst on the water.




4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the main flag mast on the lawn at the western side of the Clubhouse.



5 RACE SCHEDULE / DIVISION FLAGS

6 COURSE AND RACING AREA

6.1 The starting line will be between a mast displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and the course permanent club mark 'L' at the port end.

6.4 The finishing line will be between a mast displaying a blue flag on the committee boat at the starboard end of the line and the permanent club mark identified in the respective course. (Opposite ends for a downwind finish)

7 SHORTENING THE COURSE

7.1 The Race Officer may shorten the course at 'N' mark; yachts will be notified of a shortened course on VHF 72. [NP]

8 TIME LIMITS

8.1 We are aiming for all boats to return to the club for 1630 presentations Therefore any boats failing to finish by 1600 will be scored DNF.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM



9.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty

10 HANDICAPS

10.1 FSC Handicap only will be sailed. Handicaps will set by the Racing Committee and may not reflect the handicaps for past or future seasons. Handicaps shall not be grounds for boats to request redress. This changes rule 60.1(b).

Race Handicaps will be posted and issued via email to all race skippers the day before the race.

11 TROPHIES/PRIZES

11.1 The presentation of pennants and prizes for the days racing will be held from 1630 in the main Clubhouse Sunset Deck.

12 ANNOUCEMENT OF RESULTS

12.1 Results will be announced at approximately 1630
