#### **RACE**

- NOR
- Racing rules apply
- Category 2 safety
- Sat phone
- Autopilot OK
- Stability Cat 2

#### **RALLY**

- NORally
- Collision regulations apply
- Category 2 safety
- Sat phone
- Motoring and autopilot OK
- Stability Cat 2 + Alt



# MEETING THE NOTICE OF RACE OR RALLY REQUIREMENTS

- 80% of the work is getting to the start line!
- Study the relevant notice, ask questions, build understanding
- Produce a 'gap analysis'
- Prioritise how the gaps will be filled
- Use the resources around you:
  - Fellow participants
  - Mentor
  - Exmouth committee
  - Sailing office
- Delegate actions to crew!

## STABILITY

#### **RACE**

- ➤ ISO 12217-2 Design Category A, or
- > ORCi stability index of **II0** or greater
- Inclining test not required (if above ok)

#### **RALLY**

- ➤ ISO 12217-2 Design Category A, or
- > ORCi stability index of **II0** or greater
- ➤ SSSN (seaworthiness and stability screening number) of 28 min is an acceptable alternative
  - ➤ Basic boat data required
  - Calculated by RORC
  - ➤ Cost ~ \$150/boat for Bali



## INSURANCE

- >3<sup>rd</sup> party insurance required for race & rally
- >Owners decision on hull & rig insurance
- Many insurance companies require a rig inspection, possibly a hull inspection report
- ➤ Some insurance companies have special requirements North of 26 degrees➤ Higher premiums, higher excess, reduced coverage etc
- If a rig inspection is required, suggest book ASAP

## RACE & RALLY FULLY CREWED (4 OR MORE)

- ➤ 50% or greater of the crew must have completed a Category 2 race or an equivalent passage
- ➤ Complete a qualifying passage ≥ 150 nautical miles not more than nine months before, with skipper + 50% of the crew on board.
- ➤ Opportunities to build experience
  - ➤ WA offshore races Bunbury, Cape Naturaliste
  - ➤ Deliveries
- Recommended build night sailing experience

## RACE & RALLY DOUBLE/THREE HANDED

- Double Handed/Three Handed to have additional, extensive experience in addition to that of Fully Crewed. (Three Handed third crewmember may be less experienced)
- ➤ It is recommended that crews:
  - be capable of operating the boat's radios and sat phone
  - be capable of using a GPS and plotting positions on a chart
  - have a sea sickness remedy that is effective for them



## **EXPERIENCE**

- > Recommend fully crewed for Rally boats
- ➤ More crew means:
  - ➤ More sleep
  - ➤ More experience
  - Teams make better decisions than individuals if time permits
- Rally boats that wish to go double or three handed must meet the same standards as the double handed race boats ie appropriately prepared

# Steps to the Start Line TRAINING





## **TRAINING**

#### **RACE & RALLY**

- >30% or greater to have completed SSSC course, 100% recommended
  - >FSC now approved to run SSSC
  - > Consider whole of boat course
- ➤One or more crew to have senior first aid or equivalent (or be a medical practitioner)
- ≥2 or more crew to have radio qualifications
- Let the sailing office know your training needs
  - >Training courses take time to organise

# **EQUIPMENT**



# **EQUIPMENT**

- Extensive list of equipment required
  - **Borrow**
  - ➤ Buy second hand (e.g. Storm sails)
  - ➤ Hire (e.g. PLB's, personal AIS, satellite communications, life rafts)
  - ➤ Buy (e.g. AIS transponder) allow time for installation & testing
- ➤ Use the equipment audit checklist to self assess
- >3<sup>rd</sup> reef is an alternative to a trysail (50% of luff)
- There are several options for the storm jib




#### Oleps to the Olart Line

#### CONCLUSIONS

- > 80% of the challenge is getting the skipper, crew and boat to the start line
- > There are resources to help
  - > Fellow participants
  - > A mentor for each boat
  - > Exmouth committee
  - > On water office
  - > Equipment auditors
- ➤ Plan now to avoid a squeeze on limited resources (e.g. rigging, electronics)
