

# Notice of Race (NoR)

The Organising Authority (OA) is Fremantle Sailing Club (FSC)

### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2 for Off The Beach Boats will apply.
- 1.3. Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 1 for Keelboats Category 7 will apply.
- 1.4. Appendix B Windsurfing Fleet Racing Rules will apply.
- 1.5. Appendix T Arbitration will apply.

#### 2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available online after Tuesday 24 October 2023 on the event webpage.

#### COMMUNICATION

- 3.1. The Official Notice Board (ONB) is located at Dinghy Clubhouse Noticeboard.
- 3.2. Notices posted on the ONB may also be published on the event webpage.
- 3.3. [DP]While racing from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1. The event is open to all boats of the following invited classes:

4.2. All competitors shall be members of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing or a World Sailing MNA.



- 4.3. Wind Foil competitors not current financial members of an Australian Sailing or a World Sailing MNA, are required to be a current financial member of Windsurfing Western Australia (WWA).
- 4.4. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form online and paying with the required fee.
- 4.5. Boats may enter the event by registering via the event webpage: <a href="https://fsc.com.au/sail-freo/">https://fsc.com.au/sail-freo/</a>
- 4.6. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.7. Classes not already invited may apply to the OA for entry into the regatta. Requests shall be emailed to: sailingadmin@fsc.com.au
- 4.8. The OA reserves the right to:
  - a) Refuse entries.
  - b) Combine starts for minimum quantity classes.

#### 5. FEES

5.1. Boat entry fees are as follows:

- 5.2. There are no single race day entry fees.
- 5.3. Entry fee includes a Sail Freo t-shirt for each competitor.
- 5.4. The entry fee will be waived for boats representing regional clubs, located more than 100km from FSC.
- 5.5. If a competitor withdraws their entry, the entry fee will be refunded as follows:

#### 5.6. Late Entries

Late entries will be accepted after the closing date (1600, Monday, 16 October 2023) with payment of a Late Entry Fee of \$20 in addition to the boat entry fee.

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

7.2. Up to four (4) races may be completed on any race day.

#### 8. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

Boats shall comply with RRS 78 and may be subject to an equipment inspection at any time during the event.

#### 9. VENUE

- 9.1. The regatta site will be the Fremantle Sailing Club Dinghy Clubhouse and adjacent rigging areas.
- 9.2. Racing will be conducted in the waters adjacent to Success Harbour Fremantle Sailing Club.
- 9.3. Canteen, ample rigging lawn, multiple launching ramps, hot showers and changeroom facilities are available.

#### 10. COURSES

The courses will be windward/leeward and /or trapezoid as described in the Sailing Instructions.

#### 11. PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.

#### 12. SCORING

Scoring will be as detailed in table below:

## 14. BERTHING [DP]

- 14.1. Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the boat park / hardstand area.
- 14.2. All trailers may be stored in the areas designated by the OA. Any trailers left outside designated areas may be moved/relocated at the discretion of the OA.
- 14.3. Visiting boats may be left at the Club from Saturday 21 October 2023 and must be removed at the conclusion of the event.

## 15. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

There are no haul out restrictions.

#### 16. RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

#### 17. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD 10,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

#### 18. PRIZES & PRESENTATIONS

18.1 Overall series prizes will be given out to each class as follows:

BOATS PER CLASS	PRIZES
More than 6	1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 3 <sup>rd</sup> & 4th
6	1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> & 3rd
Less than 6	1 <sup>st</sup> only

- 18.2 Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.
- 18.3 Presentation of prizes will be held at the Sunset Deck of the main clubhouse as soon as practicable after racing on Sunday 29 October 2023.

#### 19. MEDIA RIGHTS

Competitors provide their permission for any photograph or video taken during a race to be used for purposes including but not limited to, public viewing, marketing/promotional material and web/social media. If a competitor does not want to provide their permission, they must advise the photographer.

#### 20. AMENDMENTS TO THE NoR

This NoR may be changed. Changes will be posted on the official noticeboard and may also be published on the event webpage.

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# ATTACHMENT A SUPPORT TEAMS [DP]

Support Teams, including all Support Persons, Coaches, Team Leaders and their vessels, shall comply with the following:

- All vessels shall be registered with the OA via the link below: https://fsc.com.au/sail-freo/
- 2. All vessels will be required to comply with local marine legislation. Local marine regulations specify the safety equipment to be carried. A copy of the regulations is available at:

- 3. All vessels shall only be moored in the location as directed by a FSC representative.
- 4. All vessels shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first start until all boats have finished or retired or the Race Committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment. All Vessels shall keep a minimum of 50 metres to leeward of the start line and its extension and more than 50 metres clear of any racing boat or mark of the course.
- 5. Each vessel shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10 million per incident or the equivalent.
- 6. All skippers and their crews shall wear a personal flotation device securely fastened at all times when afloat.
- 7. All vessels will be required to assist in the event of an emergency as directed by the Race Management Team.
- 8. All vessels shall have a working VHF radio and maintain a listening watch on the nominated VHF Channel/s.
- 9. All skippers shall:
  - a) attend the daily Volunteers Briefing with the Race Management Team.
  - b) wear an engine kill cord/safety lanyard or automatic engine immobilizer.
  - c) hold a current RST or equivalent powerboat licence.
- 10. The penalty for failing to comply with the above requirements may, after protest, be the disqualification of all competing boats associated with the infringing vessel.
